



The Wine Australia Regulations allow for specific exemptions to the general conditions of export under legislated circumstances. Shipments over 100 litres require an Export Permit, however, exporters are exempt from the requirement to be licensed when certain criteria are met.

The criteria include situations where the grape products being exported are:

- contained in the personal luggage of a traveller
- for the household of an individual who is moving house
- for display at a trade fair or comparable event
- for a scientific or technical purpose
- for diplomatic or consular establishments as part of the duty-free allowance of the establishment
- for victualling supplies that are held on board a means of international transport, or
- commercial samples for a prospective buyer.

Step 1. Applicant Details

- Will this application be made under an export licence? Y/N

Note: non-licenced applicants are required to make payment via credit card at the time of application

Step 2. Exporter Details

- Export Licence

Step 3. Exemption and destination

- Which market will the shipment be going to?
- What is the reason for your exemption application?
- Will import certificates be required for this shipment? Y/N
- Estimated departure date
- Mode of transport? Sea/Air

Step 4. Shipment Items

- Shipment items
 - Product style
 - Number of cartons
 - Items per carton
 - Unit volume
 - Invoice FOB

Step 5. Review

- Review information provided and make final changes if required using Edit option next to each section.
- Declaration

Step 6. Submit

- Confirmation email of application number
- Export approval email will be sent including the shipping record number and export permit number (WBC)
